The Triangulum project demonstrates how a system's innovation approach based around the European Commission's Smart Cities and Communities (SCC) Strategic Implementation Plan (SIP) can

drive dynamic smart city development. Focused on the three lighthouse cities Manchester (United Kingdom), Eindhoven (the Netherlands) and Stavanger (Norway), Triangulum's goal is to reduce the energy consumption of buildings, increase the use of renewable energies, increase the utilisation of electric vehicles, deploy intelligent energy management technologies and create an adaptive and dynamic ICT data hub. The design and implementation of innovative business models and the activation of citizens as co-creators are core cross-cutting elements of the project.

Bright Lights of Manchester



From Manchester, UK over to Eindhoven, the Netherlands where around two-hundred residents of the neighbourhood Eckart-Vaartbroek were present at the official opening of the innovative lighting route in October 2017.

A footpath around a pond has been illuminated with smart lighting poles to make the area more accessible and safer to walk. But that's not all: A smart interactive trail of lights is set out to guide walkers or runners on their way. They can determine their own pace by setting the lights which turn on and off in a certain time-span.

Interested in Home Renovation?

Join the European Commission who is organising a webinar on Home Renovation in Europe from the Users Perspective, in partnership with the UN Environment Finance Initiative on Tuesday 27th of February 2018, from 11.00 to 13.00 Central European Time.

The discussion will open with an introduction by Christophe Milin from the European Commission, (Executive Agency for Small and Medium Enterprises), who will give an overview of upcoming Horizon 2020 funding calls relating to home renovation. This webinar will then include tree presentations: Alice Morcrette from the Picardie Pass Rénovation will speak about how their scheme links financial and technical offers to stimulate uptake of renovation. A presentation from The Buildings Performance Institute of Europe will follow about the role of building renovation passports in driving deep renovation. Davide Cannarozzi from PACENation Europe will present the PACE financing system and how this is being brought from the USA to Europe. The webinar will be conducted in English and will be moderated by Christophe Milin.
