From 5-7 June 2018, the SCIS consortium was represented at this year's **European Union Sustainable Energy Week (EUSEW)**. More than 2.500 participants attended the Networking Village and over 60 sessions at the Policy Conference organised by the European Commission's Directorate-General for Energy and the Executive Agency for Small and Medium-sized Enterprises (EASME). The focus of [#EUSEW18](#) was 'Lead the clean

energy transition'. The [EU Energy Poverty Observatory \(EPOV\)](#) is an exciting new initiative by the European Commission to help Member States in their efforts to combat energy poverty. It exists to improve the measuring, monitoring and sharing of knowledge and best practice on energy poverty. It has an indicator dashboard and hundreds of examples of practical policies and measures.

— What's the Number?

The EU has compiled a new list of all cities that are taking part in EU sustainability initiatives. This excel lists the cities participating in eight European initiatives, the country and number of residents and the level of their involvement:

- Smart cities and CONCERTO calls in FP6, FP7 and Horizon 2020: lighthouse and follower cities, as well as details of their participation (229 cities)
- EIP-SCC Market place: number of commitments (299 cities)
- Covenant of Mayors: status (7779 cities)
- CIVITAS: number of projects (63 cities)
- Green Digital Charter: signatory status (53 cities)
- European Energy Award: status (1444 cities)
- EU Capitals of the Year (18 cities)
- Sustainable Urban Mobility Plan (720 cities)

The list has filter functions, which enables the user to find easily the cities satisfying their criteria. This can be a useful tool for cities, SMEs, industry, research establishment and academia to find project or business partners!

RUGGEDISED @ EUSEW

The European funded Lighthouse project, RUGGEDISED, organised a policy session during the [European Union Sustainable Energy Week](#), on 6 June, to talk about the contribution of energy smart solutions on social cohesion in cities.

The session, moderated by Carsten Rothballer from ICLEI, brought together experiences from cities and experts to discuss different approaches and challenges in thinking about the impact of smart cities on citizens and their quality of life.

The Lighthouse cities of Florence (Italy) and Glasgow (UK) stressed the impact of energy solutions in socially-challenged neighborhoods. In order to reduce energy bills and increase energy security, they are aiming for connected buildings and local renewable energy generation. The question of comfort and security, thanks to better energy and peak load management, was addressed with the example of the university district in the city of Umeå (Sweden). Lighthouse cities as well as experts from the Architecture's Council of Europe and Urban Innovation Vienna (Austria) highlighted the collective social responsibility and the necessity of integrating all stakeholders of the energy supply chain from planners to resident's right at the start of urban development projects for a successful transformation.



New E-bike Sharing Launches at Vienna Central Cemetery

On 24 April 2018, Smarter Together launched a new e-bike sharing service, together with e-bike provider Sycube and the Viennese Central Cemetery as the governance institution. The bikes are docked at the Viennese Central Cemetery, which spans for about 2.5 km² and is the second biggest cemetery in Europe with more than 100.000 visitors per year. It is an impressive cultural heritage site with major monuments in the “Jugendstil” (the Austrian version of Art Nouveau) and art deco style. There are also numerous funeral monuments of famous individuals, from presidents to pop stars. The green area is also a major recreational area.
